Trecently had the pleasure of chatting with our April speaker, Dawn McAndrews, who took on the position of Producing Artistic Director of Theater at Monmouth



in late 2011. She is a delightful, down to earth woman who has wrestled with the issue of balancing career and home responsibilities, as have all of us. Dawn will speak to us from the

perspective of one who has spent a portion of her working life in the theater, perhaps one of the more difficult arenas in which to manage that balancing act. At the same time, she'll shed light on the challenges and pleasures of her new position plus I think she'll let us in on some enticing tidbits about the upcoming season at the theater.

Dawn is an accomplished director, producer, and educator who has worked at theatres across the country including Shakespeare Theatre Company, Steppenwolf Theatre, Arena Stage, Portland Stage Company, and Shakespeare Festival St. Louis. Recent

directing credits include The Language Archive (Public Theatre), The Glass Menagerie and Three Days of Rain (1st Stage) Sarah Ruhl's Eurydice (The Orange Girls) and Timberlake Wertenbaker's Antigone (Saint Louis University). Theater at Monmouth credits include The Mousetrap, On the Twentieth Century, Romeo & Juliet, Henry IV, Part 1, Of Thee I Sing, Hamlet, and This Wonderful Life. She served as arts education consultant for the National Endowment for the Arts. Theatre Communications Group, the Shakespeare Theatre Association, and the D.C. Arts and Humanities Education Collaborative's Ford Foundation Initiative among others. As founder of the Teaching Artist Training Lab, an initiative designed to increase the capacity of teaching artists working in both schools and community-based organizations, she has facilitated trainings on arts-integrated curricula and inclusive learning environments.

From 1994-2007 she taught Arts Integration for Elementary School Teachers at UCLA Extension and served as Adjunct Faculty in the Performing Arts Department at Saint Louis University. She holds a Master of Fine Arts in Directing and a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Performance. Dawn produced the 2010 International VSA Festival in Washington, D.C. featuring artists with disabilities from 67 countries and 47 events in 18 venues reaching audiences of more than 500,000.

Dawn joined Theater at Monmouth as producing artistic director in October 2011. She lives in Harpswell with her partner Jim and their two fabulous boys, Max and Ewan.
